REGULATIONS FOR THE TWO YEAR DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF EDUCATION (B.Ed.)

- The B.Ed. program shall be of duration of two academic year, which can be completed in a maximum of three year.
- The minimum attendance of student teacher shall have to be 80% for all course work and practicum, 90% for school internship.
- The course structure of B.Ed. two year program is designed with three broad curricular areas as perspectives (core), curriculum and pedagogic studies (teaching methods), practicum (engagement with the field)

IN THE FIRST YEAR

Category 1 is Perspectives (core) comprises of three compulsory papers as-

- 1- Philosophical Perspectives of Education.
- 2- Sociological Perspectives of Education of India.
- 3- Psychological Perspectives of Education.

The maximum marks of the the perspectives paper will be 100 marks out of which 80 marks will be external and 20 marks will be internal.

Cat. 2 is Curriculum & pedagogic Studies (teaching methods) wherein the student has to choose two teaching methods out of Subject : Science Biology/Biology/Physical/ mathematics/Social Science/ Language-Hindi/English/Urdu/Sanskrit/Arts/Home Science/Music/ Commerce Other Region-specific language. The maximum marks of Curriculum & Pedagogic studies will be 100 marks out of which 100 marks will be external and 20 marks will be internal (which includes micro teaching 5 skills + Integrated) 3 marks per skills + 5 = 20

Cat. 3 is practicum which is compulsory this category is sub-divided in to 5 areas- Paper VI Language Proficiency, Paper VII Health, Physical and Yoga Education Paper VIII Information and Communication Technology will be evaluated through grades (A=EXCELLENT, B=VERY GOOD, C=SATISFACTORY, D=UNSATISFACTORY)

Paper IX (a) Observation IX (b) Internship and Paper X Practice of teaching Final Practice of Teaching (Each Method) Paper IX comprises of 2 part -

- IX a - observatio of one week before internship, this will be of maximum 10 marks, which will be evaluated internally on the basis of comprehensive report of the observation by the observer to the concerned subject teacher.
- IX b- includes internship and practice of teaching (1 month) which will be of maximum 20 marks evaluated by the lesson planning which will include One criticism Plan Teaching in each teaching subject each subject (Total 40)

IN THE SECOND YEAR

Category 1 Perspectives (core) comprises of 4 compulsory perspective as-

- Contemporary Indian Society and Education.
- Development of Educational Leadership and Management.
- Development of Education System in India and its Challenges.
- Curriculum Development and Assessment.

the maximum marks for all the perspectives paper will be 100 marks out of which 80m marks will external & 20 marks will be internal.

Cat. 2 in practices which comprises of paper Vth, VIth will be evaluated through grades as done in the first year, paper VIIth is 16 weeks internship programme of 50 marks which is compulsory, its evaluation will be done internally by the respective supervisors in consultation with the lead as mentioned below.

- On the basis of activities in the school like action research, cumulative record of child during internship, application o fachievement test, report of organizing co curricular activities in the school & preparation of improvised apparatus/audio visual aids.

Paper VIIIth will be evaluated externally through a comprehensive viva voce of student practicum and theory papers of the second year.

At the end of session there will be Paper IX Final Practice of teaching of 100 marks, 50 marks for each method however the marks will be given by external expert.

- Maximum marks : as mentioned against each paper in the table above for 1st 2nd year.
- Classification of results :
 - 60% and above - 1st division
 - 48% and above but below 60%-2nd division
 - Below 48%- fail.
- Two parts in theory a candidate must obtain 40% in each paper & 48% in aggregate. (both in internal & external separately)
- In every internal practice of perspectives curriculum and pedagogic studies 5 marks out of 20 will awarded as under for attendance.

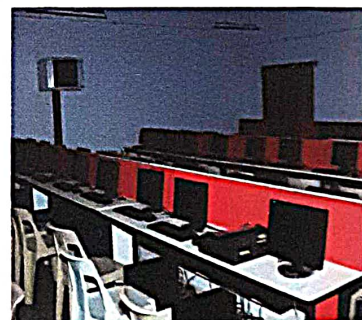
Above 90%- 5marks	85% to 90% - 4marks	80% to 85% - 3 marks
70% to 80% - 2 marks	60% to 70% - 1 marks	below 60% - 0 marks
- The medium of the written exam shall either the Hindi or English only.

NOTE - the student will be awarded divisions separately as Practice in Teaching and for rest theory and practicum papers in 100 marks and 1100 marks respectively.

Campus Facilities

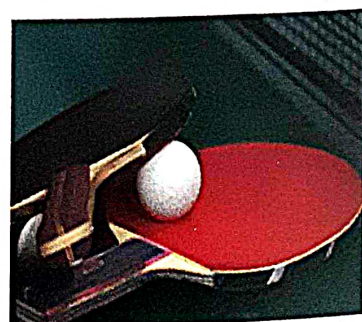
The college offers a wide range of facilities to the students. These include-

Rules and Regulations

“Student's Conduct and Discipline Rules Attendance, Punctuality and Discipline”

APPLICATION OF RULES

These Rules shall apply to all the students of MAHARANA PRATAP COLLEGE FOR TEACHER'S TRAINING.

GENERAL CODES

- Student should come to college in decent outfits.
- Smoking and use of Alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Mobile tones should be switched off in college premises, classrooms and labs. It can be used in the Lunch break time.
- I-card is mandatory to bring. The security at the main gate or any authoritarian person can check I-card and Personal belongings.
- Only I-card holders are allowed in college premises. No outsider is allowed in college premises without administrative permission.

ACADEMICS RULES

- All six days (Mon-sat) are working days except holidays.
- College timings are 10:00 am to 3:00pm.
- 75% attendance in theory is mandatory. No relaxation of any kind will be granted to a student who fails to fulfill the college's requirement. In case attendance is short, the student will not be eligible for final Examination.
- A student's name will be struck off the rolls on account of continued, unexplained absence for 1 Month.
- There is no provision for short/ half day leave. Absence from the college for social functions should be discouraged.
- A student must take permission from concerned lecturer and head before proceeding on leave.
- If the student is late to college more than twice, he/she will not be allowed to attend the college.

ACTS OF INDISCIPLINE AND MISCONDUCT

- Damaging or defacing college property or the property of the members of the college or any other property inside or outside the college premises.
- Engaging in any attempt as wrongful confinement of teachers, officers, employees and students of the college or camping inside or creating nuisance inside the boundaries of the college.
- Use of abusive and derogatory slogans or intimidatory language or incitement of hatred and violence or any act calculated to further the same.
- Eve-teasing or disrespectful behaviour to women or girl students.
- Any assault upon or intimidation of or insulting behaviour towards a teacher, officer, employee or student or any other person.
- Getting enrolled in more than one course of study simultaneously in violation of university rules.

- Committing forgery, tempering with or misuse of college documents or records, identification cards etc.
- Indulging in act of gambling in the college premises.
- Possessing or using weapons such as knives, lathis, iron chains, iron rods, sticks, explosives and fire arms in the college- premises.
- Arousing communal, caste or regional feeling or creating disharmony among students.
- Tearing of pages, defacing, burning or destroying books of library or seminars.
- Pasting of posters or distributing pamphlets, handbills etc. of objectionable writing on the walls and disfiguring building.
- Any act of moral turpitude.

RULES FOR COMPUTER LAB

- Students will be allowed to work in computer lab during practical hours only. Permission of the concerned lecturer is must if anyone wants extra hours.
- Visiting internet sites that are unethical, banned and not used for academic purpose is strictly prohibited.
- Using E-mail facility for personal purpose, chatting, playing computer games is strictly prohibited.
- Any student found misusing computer facility will be liable for disciplinary action.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

- All students should know themselves regarding the office timings and other administrative and examination matters, for the same it is expected to read notices displayed from time to time.
- College administration is not answerable or responsible for any misread or misplace of notices by the students.

NATURE OF PENALTIES

- Written warning and information to the guardian.
- Fine as may be warranted by the nature of case.
- Suspension from the class/college/library/labs or withdrawal of any other facility of this nature.
- Recovery of pecuniary loss caused to the college property.
- Non-Issue of character certificate.
- The punishment as a consequence of disciplinary action may be as follows:
 - Warning ○ Censure ○ Fine
 - Suspension ○ Rustication
